JANUARY'S THEME: LIVING BY INTENTION

January 2: TED Talk - Life on Purpose: How Living for What Matters Changes Everything. Victor Strecher, an award-winning pioneer in the field of behavioral science, lost his nineteen-year-old daughter to a rare heart disease. This life event challenged every aspect of Strecher's experience and drove him to an exhaustive search to pinpoint the potential and impact of purpose in our lives. The results of this groundbreaking investigation are revelatory and the crux of this TED Talk. Strecher's smart, personal, and highly practical talk will fundamentally change the way we understand what it means to lead a good life.

January 9: Living by Intention- In this new year, we listen for the heart's intentions; we hear from *Let's Get Real*, January's Cause of the Month, supporting

recovery from opioid addiction. The service will be led by Rev. Mary.

January 16: Compassionate Communication asks us to be aware of our own feelings and needs; opening to one another, becoming capable of creating an evolving spiritual community, together. Service led by Zellda Zelley and Rev. Mary.

January 23: Called to Love. We honor bell hooks, social critic & visionary, professor & poet, "Like all great mysteries, we are all mysteriously called to love, no matter the conditions of our lives. The persistence of this call gives us reason to hope." Service led by Rev. Mary.

January 30: The Power and the Story. When Joseph Campbell was an undergraduate at Columbia in the 1920s, he was certain that organized religion would not survive the twentieth century. A decade later he admitted he was wrong and devoted his life to finding out the why of this failed prediction. Join with Bob and Fran Mulkins this Sunday for *The Power and the Story* and find out more about this iconic professor of comparative mythology.

Zoomers, join our weekly Chalice lighting at home. Place a candle in a "Chalice" of your choice near your Zoom screen and light it as we light our main Chalice.

MARY'S MUSINGS: LIVING WITH INTENTION



The Soul Matters theme for January is Living with Intention - a shift from New Year's Resolutions - which focus on the future - to the daily practice of setting and living from intention. Resolutions may come from wishful thinking, self-criticism or cultural convention. Intentions arise from the heart and are

held in the mind, to keep us focused, in tune with our deepest values.

How do we do this? Each of us creates our own way. For me, I notice the breath; becoming still, breathing into the area of the heart, I ask, "What would bring me fully present right here, right now? What would be of benefit today, this week, this month?" Allowing myself to listen.

What happens when we ask? Sometimes I don't hear anything. Sometimes I notice for the first time how tired I am or irritated or sad or ready to take action. Sometimes the answer comes as a feeling or a picture or a memory. This past year, I felt, "Gentleness." I heard, "Be gentle with yourself." "Slow down." I felt my eyes lifting, "Look up." I heard, "Enjoy what you're doing."

Intentions start in us individually. But they don't stay there. When I'm gentle with myself, I'm gentle with others. When I slow down and look up, I see you and my heart opens. To be of benefit, we have to be fully present, not trapped in habits, opinions, assumptions. To help heal the world, we have to be in our hearts, grounded in our love for life. We 'get there' with intention, moment by moment, breath by breath, together.

NEW AT OUUC! WORKSHOPS ON EFFECTIVE LISTENING

Have you ever left a meeting asking yourself, "What did we accomplish?" or saying, "What a waste of time!"? Have you ever left a conversation thinking that you knew what the other person needed and then found out that you were mistaken? Have you thought that you had a problem solved only to have it resurface?

Missed communication often happens when good listening skills are not used. It's important that we, as a community, pay attention to how we communicate with each other—one on one, in meetings, in problem-solving groups and in important conversations.

In February we will begin a series of workshops on effective listening. The first, *Listening with Compassion* will be held at Olmsted UU on **Saturday**, **February 26th**, **2022 from 1:00 to 5:00 pm**. It will be led by Zellda Zelley who has facilitated workshops for managers and executives in Fortune 500 companies in the U.S., Canada, South America, Asia the UK and Europe. If you want to improve your listening skills this workshop is for you.

Follow-up workshops will include Making Agreements, Following up on Broken Agreements and Giving Feedback.

LISTENING TO MARGINALIZED WRITERS - JANUARY

Love Lives Here: A Story of Thriving in a Transgender Family by Amanda Jetté Knox Tuesday, January 25, 1-2:30 pm on Zoom

Here's the Amazon description:

An inspirational story of accepting and embracing two trans people in a family - a family who shows what's possible when you "lead with love".

All Amanda Jetté Knox ever wanted was to enjoy a stable life. She never knew her biological father, and while her mother and stepfather were loving parents, the situation was sometimes chaotic. At school, she was bullied mercilessly, and at the age of 14, she entered a counselling program for alcohol addiction and was successful.

While still a teenager, she met the love of her life. They were wed at 20, and the first of three children followed shortly. Jetté Knox finally had the stability she craved - or so it seemed. Their middle child struggled with depression and avoided school. The author was unprepared when the child she knew as her son came out as transgender at the age of 11.

Shocked, but knowing how important it was to support her daughter, Jetté Knox became an ardent advocate for trans rights.

But the story wasn't over. For many years, the author had coped with her spouse's moodiness, but that chronic unhappiness was taking a toll on their marriage. A little over a year after their child came out, her partner also came out as transgender. Knowing better than most what would lie ahead, Jetté Knox searched for positive examples of marriages surviving transition. When she found no role models, she determined that her family would become one.

The shift was challenging, but slowly the family members noticed that they were becoming happier and more united. Told with remarkable candour and humour, and full of insight into the challenges faced by trans people, *Love Lives Here* is a beautiful story of transition, frustration, support, acceptance, and, of course, love.
