Coffee hour kicks off on Sunday, May 1 after the TED Talk. Join us as we celebrate in-person fellowship over coffee, tea and snacks once again!

UUSC has existing partners in the area from its Syrian refugee work. This includes partners such as the Hungarian Helsinki Committee who are already responding to the current crisis by providing free legal assistance, counseling, and representation so that Ukrainian asylum seekers receive

temporary protection immediately. Following the relief grants, UUSC's team will develop a strategy for longer-term recovery alongside these same partners.

Children and youth are always welcome at OUUC. Each Sunday during the church year, we have programs for them that support and teach our UU values. On most Sundays, children start in the sanctuary with parents or grandparents for opening rituals and the story for all ages. Then they go to the Sunday School wing for their own activities. On some Sundays, they are in Religious Exploration (RE) for the whole hour and may meet in the church lounge or outdoors.

We have also set up a new activities corner in the back of the sanctuary, for parents and children who want to stay together during the church service. Look for the big cuddly bear in the back pew, who welcomes shy little ones not quite ready to leave for Sunday School!

Religious Exploration schedule for May:

May 1, Fran Mulkins, Exploring Our Creativity.
Fran is a retired art teacher, She will read a special story, and provide an exciting art project for the children that relates to the story.

May 8: Flower Service: An intergenerational service is planned for this traditional spring service, celebrated in many UU churches. Children are invited to stay in the church service and join in the flower sharing ritual. Child care will be available for young children who may need their own activities in the Sunday School wing.

May 15: Sheryl Chow, Exploring Nature. Sheryl led the children on a nature walk on the church grounds on the first day of spring, bringing awareness of the early signs of changing seasons. The children looked for places where animals sheltered in the winter. In May, they will explore outside again and see the ways the earth has awakened as the seasons continue to change. Dress for the weather, always changing in the spring!

May 22: Mary Palmieri, Exploring Music. Mary will return again for another joyful music program for the kids, playing on the instruments she provides for them. Mary is an accomplished drummer, teaching the children about drumming, and how to use the instruments she brings. They make joyful music together!

May 29: Marianna Carney, Exploring UU beliefs: Marianna will help the children understand how our UU faith brings special values into the way that we live and care for each other.

Rev. Mary and the RE Committee (Emily Williams and Marianna Carney) have classes planned for the rest of this church year. Your children or grand-children are always welcome. If you are interested in the RE program, and if you like children, please consider joining the RE Committee, or volunteering as a teacher's assistant on Sunday mornings. As a policy, we have two adults with the children on Sunday mornings. No lesson planning needed, just sign up!
