
Through story and music, we'll learn how we can honor our "wild" and natural center of being! Mary Palmieri, with Sheryl Chow, will be the teachers.

OLMSTED / OBERLIN BOOK GROUP: HOMEGOING



The Olmsted / Oberlin Book Group focuses on reading the work of marginalized writers. Homegoing, A NEW YORK TIMES NOTABLE BOOK by Yaa Gyasi, is the Oberlin Common Read this year.

The novel begins in Ghana in the eighteenth century. Two half sisters are born into different villages, each unaware of the other. One will marry an Englishman and lead a life of comfort in the palatial

rooms of the Cape Coast Castle. The other will be captured in a raid on her village, imprisoned in the very same castle, and sold into slavery.

One of Oprah's Best Books of the Year and a PEN/Hemingway award winner, Homegoing follows the parallel paths of these sisters and their descendants through eight generations from the Gold Coast to the plantations of Mississippi, from the American Civil War to Jazz Age Harlem. Yaa Gyasi's extraordinary novel illuminates slavery's troubled legacy both for those who were taken and those who stayed—and shows how the memory of captivity has been inscribed on the soul of our nation.
