### FEBRUARY'S THEME: THE PATH OF LOVE

February 5: TED Talk. February's Ted Talk is by former ABC News anchor and author of "10% Happier" Dan Harris. TED says: "In a wise, funny talk, he shares his years-long quest to improve his relationships with everyone (starting with himself) and explains the science behind loving-kindness meditation, and how it can boost your resiliency, quiet your inner critic and simply make you more pleasant to be around." Brian Warren will facilitate our discussion.

February 12: Are We Defining Love the Wrong Way? Between human beings, love is a relational word. Yes, you can love things that do not love you back - the sky, or a painting, or a game of chess. But the love of other people is directional. There is a lover and a beloved - you don't just love, but you love at someone. And real love is not only about the

feelings of the lover; it is not egotism. It is when one person believes in another person and shows it. We know in our bones that love is not a feeling alone, but a feeling that flows into the world of action.

What are the many ways we can exhibit our love for another? How is love defined? Join us on Sunday February 12th and we'll explore this thought-provoking topic. Speaker: Kay Potetz. Pianist: Bob Perry. Greeter: Linda Rich

**February 19: Compassion Begins at Home.** All religions teach the Golden Rule, "Do unto others as you would have others do unto you." Yet we are harder on ourselves than on anyone else. A kind world begins with self-compassion, self-love that radiates out, in all directions. Service led by Rev. Mary. Join us for Stone Soup after the service. February 26: Appreciating Syrian Culture. Zafer Deeb will give us a brief introduction to the history of Syria, its culture, art, music and food. It will be conducted in two presentations, one in February about the geographical location of current Syria and how it changed from The Greater Syria over the years and times of domination by other nations. The second presentation will cover Syrian art, architecture, and history. Zafer is originally from Syria and has been attending OUUC for several years. This will be an Intergenerational service, finishing in Coe Hall where we will enjoy an array of Mediterranean food.





# **REV. MARY'S MUSINGS:** MAKE CHANNELS FOR THE STREAMS OF LOVE



Finding ourselves in midwinter bleak or not - how are we called to love, as intentional response to the challenges and gifts of our lives?

I write looking out at Lake Erie, a morning after two days of snow and iron-gray skies. A sunny day? No. Yet morning light plays behind eastward-moving clouds, illuminating all with colors beyond words.

I started the day reading about the Russian army learning from western criticisms of their military disorganization, gearing up for more efficient destruction of Ukraine, democracy, world peace. Do we dare be open-hearted, to love?

Reading about mass shooting after mass shooting in the US, avoiding stories of attacks on the rule of law from within Congress. Do we dare be open-hearted, to love?

Buddhism challenges us to make a vow to accept the world as it is - even as mass shootings escalate and Russian military strategy mutates like Covid.

Accepting the world doesn't mean looking away. It

means upping our capacity to love: To bear witness. To face hard truths. To allow Life to rage and weep through us. Being fully present to the heartbreak opens the channels in us, empowering us to Love life in all its evolving forms, so we may respond on its behalf, as individuals and together.

We set the intention, make the vow, knowing we will break it again and again. Forgiving ourselves and vowing again.

This is the hardest commitment of all: To love the world as it is, not the way we wish it were. Mourning the needless suffering and accepting the limits - our own and those of our time. To make this vow, I need to be lifted like I was this morning, re-energized by morning light after the storms, illuminating all, building my capacity - our capacity - to be present, and to make new channels for the streams of love, together.

The gift (and task) of UU spiritual community is to love the world as it is now, to love ourselves as we are now, and to hold us as we learn how to respond. Are we ready to make that vow together - for 5 minutes, an hour, a day, a lifetime?

### RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS FOR FEBRUARY

The goal of the OUUC religious education program is to provide a safe, welcoming, loving environment for religious edication for children and youth that is grounded in the UU principles, encourages spiritual and intellectual growth and empowers our children to live our common ideals and develop their individual faith. Each Sunday, the children begin in the sanctuary for opening rituals then go to their class for the morning program.

February 5: Sheryl Chow will read two books, "I Am Enough", by Grace Byers and "I Am Every Good Thing" by Derrick Barnes. Sheryl and Emily Williams will talk about the importance of loving yourself for who you are and how you can use yoga to show yourself love and be your best self. "Yoga is

about getting to the true you, not copying someone else's shape!" We'll finish with a yoga session, so wear something comfortable!

February 12: Marianna Carney and Sheryl Chow will discuss a trio of interrelated books. The first book, "WEIRD!", by Erin Frankel, focuses on Luisa; a girl losing faith in herself under the barrage of negative comments from a girl at school. She tries to win the bully's approval by changing herself. When that doesn't work (and after some good advice from mom) she goes back to being herself - but owning it! In the second book, a girl who was formerly bullied learns to "DARE!" to speak up for someone else (and discovers something valuable in the process). In the final book, the bully herself learns that maybe

she can still protect herself and be strong without being mean and "TOUGH!" Many kids are worried or troubled by bullying. These books teach kids different ways to deal with bullying and help themselves be more confident.

February 19: All of us get angry or upset with others sometimes ... how could we express those feelings without hurting each other? Today's music and the story, "Sometimes People Fight, Even When They Love Each Other", by Dagmar Geisler, look at healthier ways we can have disagreements with our family and friends.

**February 25:** Intergenerational service. Children will join the adults for an all-ages service about the culture of Syria.

I'm not doing it ironically,
though it might seem that way. I
once live-tweeted the September

issue."

In this book, Roxane Gay takes us through the journey of her evolution as a woman of color while also taking readers on a ride culture of the last few years and commenting on the through state of feminism today. The portrait that emerges is not only one of an incredibly insightful woman continually growing to understand herself and our society, but also one of our culture.

Bad Feminist is a sharp, funny, and spot-on look at the ways in which the culture we consume becomes who we are, and an inspiring call-to-arms of all the ways we still need to do better.
