The goal of the Olmsted UU religious education program is to provide a safe, welcoming, loving environment for religious education for children and youth that is grounded in the UU principles, encourages spiritual and intellectual growth, and empowers our children to live our common ideals and develop their individual faith. Each Sunday, the children begin in the sanctuary for opening rituals then go to their class for the morning program.

May 7: Walking in the woods makes us feel calm and happy. Many children experience "nature deficiency." This Sunday, our children will joyfully connect with nature down by the Rocky River Nature Center, and then draw what they want to remember. It could be frogs, birds, squirrels, trees, flowers, leaves, water; whatever draws their attention. Emily Williams and Sheryl Chow will lead.

May 14: This week's story, "Jayden's Impossible Garden" is about opening our eyes to the beauty that's around us and using our imagination and creativity to enhance the beauty of everyday items. Marianna Carney and Sheryl Chow will be leading the class in using this idea to make a Mother's Day craft.

May 21: Fran Mulkins will be reading the enlightening and entertaining story, "Marcel's Masterpiece, How a Toilet Shaped the History of Art". Can a toilet be art? What IS art? Is it an object? An idea? Who decides? Fran will be leading a discussion of these questions and the making of crafts using found objects.

May 28: In keeping with the theme of "Creativity" for May, Mary Palmieri will lead a rhythm circle that looks at the ways that music invites us to participate in the creative process. Sheryl Chow will read the book, "Starboy" by Jami Gigot, based on the music and life of rock legend, David Bowie.
