July 2: G.A. Sunday Service 2023. The pandemic has wrought change and created uncertainty for institutions, like our Unitarian Universalist congregations, and our wider world. Who and what are we becoming, individually and collectively? The 2023 GA Sunday service explored these themes as UUs gathered in community to celebrate the best of who we are.

July 9: What Do We Hear from Boston? The Unitarian

Universalist Association headquarters is in Boston, Massachusetts. Sometimes the small UU congregations like us can feel very disconnected from the UUA headquarters. This Sunday, we will gather information from people who went to the recent General Assembly in Pittsburgh, and get news of proposed changes and other plans which may affect UUs. There was an election, a proposal to change some of the UUA By-Laws, and many other presentations on activities which may be of interest to all of us. Come and get an update on "the room where it happened!"

July 16: Finding Our Roots, Part 1. Our own OUUC started out as a Universalist church, founded as the First Universalist Society in 1834! In the new state of Ohio, Universalist beliefs were spreading across the

growing and developing state and becoming quite popular with the pioneers. What did the Universalists believe, and how did they live out their beliefs in our own church? Service will be led by Marianna Carney.

July 23: Finding Our Roots, Part 2. OUUC became a Unitarian Universalist Church in 1961, when the separate Unitarian and Universalist churches decided to merge into the Unitarian Universalist Association (the UUA as we know it). Although many individual churches had already merged, because of common beliefs, it was not official until 1961. We will briefly explore the history and beliefs of the Unitarian religion. Brian Warren will lead this service.

July 30: TED Talk - The Great Migration and the Power of a Single Decision. Isabel Wilkerson, acclaimed author of the award winning book, "The Warmth of Other Suns", talks about the power of the single decision that changed the course of families and lineages and countries and history to the current day. Wilkerson focuses on the consequences, personally and nationally, of the migration of millions of African Americans out of the Jim Crow south from World War I to the 1970's. Discussion facilitated by Lynda Garvin.
