## **2021-2022** Minister's Annual Report to the Congregation from Rev. Mary Grigolia to Olmsted Unitarian Universalist Congregation

This has been a tumultuous year, with morphing pandemic and attacks on democracy, the rule of law - at home and around the world. Before OUUC welcomed us back into the building on Sunday mornings this winter, members and friends (and I) complained about Zoom yet showed up consistently, grateful for continuing connections, surprised by their depth, "even on Zoom."

With the world around us, we are in a collective sea of anxiety, irritation, loss, fear, confusion. Much of what was normal collapsed or shifted. Including assumptions. This is also an unparalleled opportunity to explore who we are becoming.

At the beginning of this fiscal year, Emily, Jen and Pat represented OUUC at Getting the Word Out, a workshop series to identify our "brand essence," to help us rebuild with upto-date clarity of why we're here and what we offer. Our brand essence emerged as, "Evolving Connections."

We need more ways to connect. And connecting is not the whole story. OUUC is not a social club. Its essence is to help members and friends (and staff) evolve through our connections with each other - to heal old wounds, to get unstuck, so we may grow - becoming who we <u>can</u> be, who we <u>yearn</u> to be, true to our deepest wisest selves, together. One team member, Pat, volunteered to get our message out on our new electronic sign, making visible who we are and what we offer. Technology demands resources, attention and time. All appeared. It's still a new project. In response, a few new-comers noticed, emailed and appeared.

This has been a challenging year for leadership at OUUC. Our Board President and Treasurer resigned. The accounting system of the congregation has been overhauled, in response to repeated requests of the Board for transparency and more detailed financial record-keeping.

Amidst turmoil, throughout the year, OUUC programs for spiritual connection and deepening remained robust and well-attended.

Sunday service attendance and participation remained mostly stable, with a few people falling away and a few new-comers showing up. There is enthusiasm for being together on-site for coffee hour, Circle Suppers, WISE Women.

There was robust participation from Olmsted UU (and from Oberlin UU) at the January Worship Retreat, wrestling with what people yearn for and need from our congregation(s). Responses provide us a road map for rebuilding connections in this coming year and for deepening explicitly our focus on UU spiritual practices - using the principles, values, and sources to root us in new ways of being and offering spiritual community to respond to the needs of our time.

The book group, reading marginalized writers, Zoomed with authors. The monthly poetry group connected us and lifted spirits. Dream Group stayed stable on Zoom. WISE Women grew with hybrid participation and rotating leadership. The holiday craft session was deeply appreciated. The Joseph Campbell series went well in-person. Compassionate Listening was enthusiastically received, went deep and introduced a shared approach to communication at OUUF. People are grateful to have the option of attending in-person on Sundays.

And, like other communities, we're experiencing reactivity. Pandemic has been hard emotionally, psychologically, physically and spiritually. We're in uncharted waters, between the worlds, without a map. Our compass must be our Universalist heritage, Love, supported by our UU Principles and Sources.

When 'normal' disappears we see problems. Our culture bullies us with the expectation that we should be able to solve it all ourselves. Changing congregational patterns can only be done together with intention and kindness. It is much easier to find someone to blame. Some of us blame ourselves. Some blame others. Some blame the congregational system (or the governmental system).

We need each other. We need to foster gatherings to get know each other. And to listen to all that is arising for us now.

There is collective power when we come together - for new possibilities, new ways forward. Our task now is to create sacred moments for listening, heart to heart, sharing vulnerabilities, learnings, questions, hopes, dreams and inspirations. Planting a new garden together.

The first round of the stewardship drive for 2022-2023 did not bring in enough money to fund the congregation for the new year. Is this the year that Olmsted UU will dream a new dream, a new way forward, or vote to dissolve and mourn the end of a historic spiritual community?

OUUC needs to replant its program for children and youth. Though small, the seeds are promising.

Over the past ten years, OUUC pioneered spiritual deepening programming for the second half of life. Will OUUC deepen this ministry and reach out to the wider community?

Will OUUC embrace these two disparate ministries as one community of mutual support? Or will we each take what we learned to other projects and people?

This is a year for connecting and reconnecting.

For individual and congregational truth-telling, clear-seeing.

This is a year for reassessing our model of congregation - what people want and need (from Sunday morning, from midweek programs, from opportunities to serve and lead), how people connect, what helps us learn and evolve.

This is a year for deepening our spiritual practices and self-awareness as UUs, focusing on Love, delving deeply into the UU sources, principles and values.

This is a time for connecting, listening, learning, and caring for each other and the community that enables us to come together with all our questions and needs.

This is a time to upgrade our operating system: to trust Love to hold our yearnings and needs, to reach out to and welcome those around us in need of open-hearted, openminded, evolving spiritual community.

#### **Religious Education Report for Annual Meeting, June 2022**

During this church year, religious education classes have been provided on a weekly basis for the children and youth of OUUC. Caitlin Chapman was the Director of Religious Education for most of the year but submitted her resignation in February. Her last day of work was on March 6, 2022. Caitlin said that she would continue her church membership but has not attended since that time. We thank Caitlin for her loving care of the children, her guidance to them in living their UU principles, and for the stories for all ages in Sunday Service that adults and children enjoyed. Caitlin also was an active member of the TED Talk team, and helped with selection of TED Talks.

Since March 3, the RE Committee (Emily Williams and Marianna Carney, guided by Rev. Mary) has continued to provide programming for the children every Sunday, relying on talented church volunteers who brought excellent learning experiences to the OUUC children. The children have really enjoyed the programming. Emily and Marianna assisted the volunteer teachers.

Thank you to these volunteers who brought their own ideas and supplies: Sheryl Chow for nature education (usually outdoor experiences) Fran Mulkins for stories and art projects Mary Palmieri for music education, especially drumming Bob Williams (as Mister Wizard) for a Sunday of safe science experiments Marianna Carney for UU history and principles Emily Williams for Easter canned goods donation hunt and her consistent support

The RE Committee asked Sheryl Chow to be a regular RE assistant, starting in May, so there would be a consistent presence in the classroom for children and their parents. She has done an excellent job and has great rapport with the children. We hope to continue our contract with her for the coming year.

Children's attendance has been very low, but we have had four visiting children who have come more than once. We hope to be able to continue to attract more young families once we return to in-person church. We believe an RE program is important for the future of the church. We welcome volunteers on RE Committee and in the classroom. Please let us know if you would like to contribute to religious education at OUUC.
