SEPTEMBER THEME: THE PRACTICE OF INVITATION

September 1: TED-Style Talk: "The Five Reasons You Should NOT be a Unitarian". In a video sermon, Rev. Daniel Kanter says you should not be a Unitarian if you: 1) Want to believe anything you want. 2) Only want to be with people like yourself. 3) Are thin skin 4) Don't know how to sin 5) Don't want to be more generous, compassionate, and to serve others. Brian Warren will facilitate our discussion.

September 8: Welcome to a New Beginning. A new beginning means that you are allowing yourself to accept changes that might bring good things to you. It means that you are open to thousands of new opportunities that will define a new version of your personality. Let's discuss the possibilities! Kay Potetz will lead our service.

participate in a Welcome Back Potluck and Intergenerational Drumming circle. It will be held outside, weather permitting.

September 15: Hear the Real Story. Suspension of disbelief is critical to an enjoyment of fiction, fantasy and myth. But what happens when religion more and more requires a permanent suspension of disbelief? This talk is about art and science creating a synthesis of new knowledge and human emotion and meaning. Bob Mulkins will lead our service.

September 22: TED-Style Talk - The Problem with Plastics. Plastics are everywhere -- they're in our favorite electronic devices, they package our food and insulate our homes. Today, the total mass of plastic is twice the total mass of all living organisms on the planet. Plastic pollution researcher Patricia Villarrubia-Gomez breaks down the consequences of producing all of this plastic at every stage, from fossil fuel extraction to the disposal of single-use plastics in landfills and oceans. The first step to breaking free of our plastic problem is admitting we have one. Our discussion will be led by Zafer Deeb

September 29: Vulemu Benvenutu: We Want to Welcome. The Rev. Ian Anderson says this about his service, "Invitation and welcoming is an ongoing process based on compassion, reflection, and intention. When and where does it start? When we go from 'You can sit with us' to 'We want you to sit with us' we begin to allow the spirit of humanity to reside not just near us, but within us."
